NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE VOORHEESVILLE CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

1. Pursuant to State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) amended June 26, 2000 and effective July 12, 2000, and the resulting Commissioner of Education Regulation 8 NYCRR amended effective November 15, 2000, the Voorheesville Central School District will act as Lead Agency in determining compliance with SEQRA in regard to **Project Number 01-10-03-06-0-001-015. The scope of this project is defined as “Junior Senior High School Reconstruction Project, CSI Section(s) 9,155,15,16”.**

2. NYSDEC Regulations Part 617 defines Lead Agency as follows:
“Lead agency means an involved agency principally responsible for undertaking, funding or approving an action, and therefore responsible for determining whether an environmental impact statement is required in connection with the action, and for the preparation and filing of the statement if one is required.”
3. A copy of this resolution shall be placed on file in the office of the District Clerk where the same shall be available for public inspection during business hours.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE VOORHEESVILLE CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

1. **Based upon the review by the Board of Education of the proposed capital project, Number 01-10-03-06-0-001-015, the scope of which is defined as “Junior Senior High School, Reconstruction, CSI Section(s) 9,155,15,16”, the Board hereby finds that the proposed action constitutes a “Type II Action” as such quoted term is defined in the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the regulations of the Department of Environmental Conservation of the State of New York (6 NYCRR part 617, as amended) promulgated thereunder (“SEQRA”) and, therefore, is not subject to any further review by the School District under SEQRA.** A Listing of such Type II actions is attached hereto. The action consists of routine activities of an educational institution with no contemplated expansion of the existing facilities and any improvements to such facilities will be in the nature of replacement rehabilitation or reconstruction of the facilities in kind, on the same site.

This resolution shall take effect immediately.
